THE DOORS ARE OPEN! We are so grateful, and our guests are thrilled to be back at St. Francis Retreat. They are excited about being able to gather with others. On May 10, we were elated to open our doors to the clergy of the Diocese of San Jose. Since that week, we have had guests during most weeks. Unfortunately, some individuals in our groups are hesitant to gather with others, so the numbers in our groups are smaller than before the pandemic.

Most of our staff has returned and are working hard to provide a beautiful place with delicious meals. They, too, are pleased to be back to work. They are a great group of employees!

On June 15, 2020, the retreat house hosted a regularly scheduled outdoor Sunday Mass for the first time. The Mass continues, but it has moved inside since the end of October 2021. People come from as far away as San Jose and close to San Juan Bautista and the Salinas Valley and Monterey area.

Our financial stability is fragile at best as we end our first quarter of the fiscal year. However, we can pay our bills by the generosity of the Province of St. Barbara of the Franciscan Friars and our benefactors. The province has provided us with two loans to keep our doors open and pay the staff. As we are all aware, since the pandemic, the costs of everything have increased. Thus, we provided a modest increase in wages to our employees to help with the rise in cost-of-living.

We continue with our weekly Advent and Lenten Days of Recollection, our monthly First Friday Days of Recollection, our annual 73rd Men's Retreat in January, GLBTQ Retreat in May, English Speaking Women's Retreat in June.

We wait for the arrival of a friar from El Salvador to serve the Spanish speaking with retreats, Days of Recollection in the coming months. We are currently waiting for his religious VISA to be issued.

Ed DeGroot, Director of Operations for the last twenty years, is looking forward to retirement. The past year has been a time of uncertainty for St. Francis Retreat and most of us. There have been some unhappy times, but we have attempted to maintain a sense of personal and corporate joy. St. Francis spoke of "perfect joy" as spawned by patience and humble acceptance. So may we approach the Advent and Christmas season with patience and acceptance of the uncertainty of life today.



For the past four years, we have been planning and soliciting funds for the renovation of St. Francis Court. We were recently informed by those providing the grant for the renovation that the funds are not available at this time. Because of the pandemic, the pre-pandemic costs were approximately one-third less than the post-pandemic projection for the project. 

Some Good News

SISTER WATER PROJECT

St. Francis Retreat has always had water issues. We have one well which provides 4,000,000 gallons of water a year. In the past few years of drought, with the lakebed dry, the well has dropped considerably. As a former retreat director once said, "No Water, No Retreat."

Thanks to the cooperative effort of civil engineering students at Santa Clara University, a plan has been designed to recharge our groundwater using an off-site well that has been out of service for over twenty years. Like much of the groundwater in the San Juan area, this well has a high concentration of nitrates due to decades of agricultural fertilizers used in the San Juan Valley. The students have designed a "bio-reactor" using eucalyptus wood chips to de-nitrify the water. This proposal has passed the scrutiny of two civil engineering review boards.

Other students from the university have assisted in applying for grants to cover the cost. We have received a pledge of \$23,000 from the Franciscan Action Network in Washington, D.C and have received financial support from the Province of Saint Barbara. A separate grant is being prepared to present to the State of California Water Resources Board to fund water systems dealing with climate change challenges.


